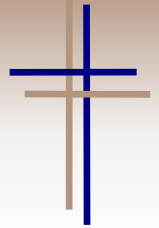

From the Pastor

Sin of omission?

The story that unfold in the Gospel tells of what it would be like to experience the rewards of God's glorious kingdom or punishment in the fires of hell and reveals the "had I known" kind of reaction to the rich man. The torment is so intense to the extent that he begs on behalf of his brothers and sisters on earth to be told of what really happens after our earthly life. Abraham tells him exactly what he himself ignored; the voices of prophets and the teaching of the law. Would the voice from the dead make a difference? Who would believe that?

The call to holiness and readiness to encounter God is written in our hearts as a desire to always embark on what is good and this is not only for heavens' sake rather because it is in the DNA of the goodness that God inscribes and gives from conception. It is inbuilt. It is rooted in what Jesus calls service to "the little ones" or having the child like attitude - filled with indifference and away from any presumptuous, calculated relationships, or away from self righteous attitude of the "am more holier than they", or am more deserving shtick. Desire for goodness is inbuilt; in such a way that we struggle with going back to it when we knowingly or unknowingly drift from it or when our world view has been changed and is mixed with whole lot of stuff to the extent we lose sight of God's kingdom or it seems all the more less important. The gospel reading seems to capitalize that relationships here on earth are key to paving the way to the heavenly Kingdom. The rich man kept on living lavishly and couldn't care less about the poor guy at the doorstep. Only now he realizes – a kind gesture, a shared meal, would warrant his understanding of God's providential care and a place at Abraham's bosom.

When do I chose to care and why do I chose not to?

Have I blindfolded myself and simply chose to close my heart and I don't have to do as the commands asks of me because I have my way of living the gospel?

How am I prepared to encounter the Lord without guilt of omission, self indulgence or complacency?

¿Pecado de omisión?

La historia que se desarrolla en el Evangelio cuenta cómo sería experimentar las recompensas del glorioso reino o castigo de Dios en los fuegos del infierno y revela el tipo de reacción "si hubiera sabido" al hombre rico. El tormento es tan intenso en la medida en que ruega en nombre de sus hermanos y hermanas en la tierra que se les cuente lo que realmente sucede después de nuestra vida terrenal. Abraham le dice exactamente lo que él mismo ignoró; Las voces de los profetas y la enseñanza de la ley. ¿La voz de los muertos haría la diferencia? ¿Quién creería eso?

El llamado a la santidad y la preparación para encontrarnos con Dios está escrito en nuestros corazones como un deseo de embarcarnos siempre en lo que es bueno y esto no es solo por el bien de los cielos sino porque está en el ADN de la bondad que Dios inscribe y da desde la concepción. . Está incorporado. Está enraizado en lo que Jesús llama servicio a "los pequeños" o tener una actitud de niño, llena de indiferencia y lejos de cualquier relación presuntuosa y calculada, o lejos de la actitud de justicia propia del "soy más santo que ellos". más merecido . El deseo de bondad está incorporado; de tal manera que luchamos por volver a él cuando a sabiendas o sin saberlo nos alejamos o cuando nuestra visión del mundo ha cambiado y se mezcla con muchas cosas en la medida en que perdemos de vista el reino de Dios o parece que todo más menos importante. La lectura del evangelio parece capitalizar que las relaciones aquí en la tierra son clave para allanar el camino hacia el Reino celestial. El hombre rico seguía viviendo generosamente y no podía preocuparse por el pobre hombre en la puerta. Solo que ahora se da cuenta: un gesto amable, una comida compartida, garantizaría su comprensión del cuidado providencial de Dios y un lugar en el seno de Abraham.

¿Cuándo elijo cuidar y por qué elijo no hacerlo?

¿Me he vendado los ojos y simplemente he decidido cerrar mi corazón y no tengo que hacer lo que me mandan los mandamientos porque tengo mi forma de vivir el Evangelio?

¿Cómo estoy preparado para encontrarme con el Señor sin culpa de omisión, auto indulgente o complacencia?

September 29, 2019 • Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The parable of the rich man and Lazarus is a powerful and painful cautionary tale. The Gospel narrative paints a vivid picture. We can imagine the poor man, Lazarus, lying at the door of the rich man. We can see the rich man in our mind's eye, well-dressed and well-fed. The rich man has walked past Lazarus every day but has never really seen him. Even though he knows Lazarus' name, he does not matter to the rich man. Lazarus matters to God, however. The rich man did not only fail to care for Lazarus in life. He expected Lazarus to serve him in the afterlife. He is totally focused on himself. Only after he realizes the eternal consequences of his failure to care does he think of his brothers. And even then, he expects Lazarus to be his messenger! The rich man missed the point of the commandments and the witness of the prophets, in life and in death.

La parábola del hombre rico y Lázaro es una historia poderosa y dolorosa de advertencia. La narrativa del Evangelio dibuja una imagen vivida. Podemos imaginar al hombre pobre, Lázaro, tirado a la puerta del hombre rico. Podemos ver al rico hombre con nuestra mente, bien vestido y bien alimentado. El hombre rico pasa cerca de Lázaro todos los días, pero en realidad nunca lo ha mirado. Aunque conoce por nombre a Lázaro, no le interesa al hombre rico. Sin embargo, le importa a Dios. El hombre rico no solamente falló en cuidar en vida a Lázaro. Él esperaba que Lázaro le sirviera en la vida del más allá. Él está tan enfocado en sí mismo. Solamente después de que se da cuenta de las consecuencias eternas de su falta de atención, piensa en sus hermanos. E incluso entonces, ¿él espera que Lázaro sea su mensajero! El hombre rico pasó por alto el punto de los mandamientos y el testimonio de los profetas, en la vida y en la muerte.

SEE LAZARUS IN OUR MIDST

As people of faith, Lazarus must matter to us as well. It is impossible to hear this parable without thinking of the poor and homeless in our cities, on our streets. We may not know them, but they have names. We may not understand their circumstances, but they are our brothers and sisters. Jesus' life and teaching show us that God's way is the way of love. Jesus sacrificed everything on the cross, and leads us to give beyond what we think we can or should, to pour ourselves out for the sake of others. How much like the rich man are we? We cannot solve all of the issues of poverty and homelessness in our cities, country, and world. But we are called to do something, to pay attention, to truly care, to advocate for justice and fairness, to see and to love the person on the street, as a person. As Lazarus.
