



LENTEN FASTING & ABSTINENCE Fasting is required of adult Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59. The required days of fasting are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. **Abstinence**, which is refraining from the consumption of meat, is obliged for Catholics 14 and older. Catholics are obliged to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent. Universal Church law also requires abstinence on all Fridays of the year, but in the United States, Catholics may perform another penance if they choose. Some exceptions apply: "Those that are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the physically or mentally ill including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting." © Simply Catholic & USCCB

Lenten Conversions by His Eminence Cardinal Blase Cupich


“Turn away from sin and believe in the Gospel.” This simple formula is spoken as we receive ashes on our heads to mark the beginning of the season of Lent. These words remind the baptized that Christian conversion involves both an ongoing rejection of a sinful life and also a fuller embrace of the Gospel.

Some years ago, I heard the story of a man who was deeply troubled by his behavior and was fearful of how things would work out with his family. He was on a business trip with colleagues and one night after heavy drinking was unfaithful to his wife. It was the first and only time, but he knew that he had terribly injured his soul and the relationship with his wife of many years. He decided to tell his wife, as he just could not live with himself. “I won’t blame you if you want a divorce, as I did the worst thing possible,” he said. She responded with a long silence and then told him, “Yes, you did the worst thing possible, but when we were married, we said it was ‘for better or worse.’ So while you have shown me your worse, let’s spend the rest of our lives showing each other our better.”

The husband needed a conversion that involved turning away from his sin and reconciling with his wife, by taking responsibility and making amends. We all have areas in our lives that harm our souls, and Lent is a time to make a radical departure from anything that has the power to corrupt our lives, especially acts that can become addictions. But the wife also experienced a conversion, one in which she came to embrace the Gospel more fully, particularly as she came to a new appreciation of her wedding vows. That kind of conversion is even more difficult. It does not involve a turning away from something that we did wrong, but a courage to take a new direction of being faithful to the Gospel when our world has been turned upside down.

Lent calls us to conversion in both ways. We should use these 40 days to examine the ways we are unfaithful to the promises we make to God and to others. Sin can creep into our lives and become second nature. Just think of how anger can morph into resentment, covetousness into jealousy and self-sufficiency into ignoring others’ needs. We need to turn away from these sins and begin again. But we should also be attentive in these days to how God’s grace is working deep within us to call us to a new and deeper understanding of the Gospel. Lent has to be a time to be in touch with the graces God is giving us now, in silent and hidden ways, much like the silent undergrowth that is taking place in the soil preparing for springtime.

Maybe that is why the word “Lent” is chosen for this season, for in old English it means springtime. “Turn away from sin and believe in the Gospel.” That is the call to a two-fold conversion as we welcome a new springtime in our faith lives.



Conversiones cuaresmales Por Su Eminencia el Cardenal Blase Cupich

"Aléjate del pecado y cree en el Evangelio". Esta simple fórmula se habla cuando recibimos cenizas en nuestras cabezas para marcar el comienzo de la temporada de Cuaresma. Estas palabras recuerdan a los bautizados que la conversión cristiana implica tanto un rechazo continuo de una vida pecaminosa como un abrazo más completo del Evangelio. Hace algunos años, escuché la historia de un hombre que estaba profundamente preocupado por su comportamiento y temía cómo funcionarían las cosas con su familia. Estaba en un viaje de negocios con colegas y una noche después de beber en exceso le fue infiel a su esposa.

Era la primera y única vez, pero sabía que había herido terriblemente su alma y la relación con su esposa de muchos años. Decidió decírselo a su esposa, ya que simplemente no podía vivir consigo mismo. "No te culparé si quieres el divorcio, ya que hice lo peor posible", dijo. Ella respondió con un largo silencio y luego le dijo: "Sí, hiciste lo peor posible, pero cuando nos casamos, dijimos que era 'para bien o para mal'. Así que mientras me has mostrado lo peor, pasemos el resto de nuestras vidas mostrándonos lo mejor".

El esposo necesitaba una conversión que implicara alejarse de su pecado y reconciliarse con su esposa, asumiendo la responsabilidad y haciendo las paces. Todos tenemos áreas en nuestras vidas que dañan nuestras almas, y la Cuaresma es un tiempo para hacer una desviación radical de cualquier cosa que tenga el poder de corromper nuestras vidas, especialmente los actos que pueden convertirse en adicciones. Pero la esposa también experimentó una conversión, una en la que llegó a abrazar el Evangelio más plenamente, particularmente cuando llegó a una nueva apreciación de sus votos matrimoniales. Ese tipo de conversión es aún más difícil. No implica alejarse de algo que hicimos mal, sino un coraje para tomar una nueva dirección de ser fieles al Evangelio cuando nuestro mundo se ha puesto patas arriba.

La Cuaresma nos llama a la conversión en ambos sentidos. Debemos usar estos 40 días para examinar las formas en que somos infieles a las promesas que hacemos a Dios y a los demás. El pecado puede infiltrarse en nuestras vidas y convertirse en una segunda naturaleza. Solo piense en cómo la ira puede transformarse en resentimiento, la codicia en celos y la autosuficiencia en ignorar las necesidades de los demás. Necesitamos alejarnos de estos pecados y comenzar de nuevo. Pero también debemos estar atentos en estos días a cómo la gracia de Dios está trabajando profundamente dentro de nosotros para llamarnos a una comprensión nueva y más profunda del Evangelio. La Cuaresma tiene que ser un tiempo para estar en contacto con las gracias que Dios nos está dando ahora, de manera silenciosa y oculta, al igual que la maleza silenciosa que está teniendo lugar en el suelo preparándose para la primavera.

Tal vez por eso se elige la palabra "Cuaresma" para esta temporada, ya que en inglés antiguo significa primavera. "Aléjate del pecado y cree en el Evangelio". Ese es el llamado a una doble conversión al dar la bienvenida a una nueva primavera en nuestras vidas de fe.
